VADA BOARD MEETING MINUTES

VADA Board Meeting Minutes
June 29, 2009
Teleconference Meeting

Members present: Bettina Longaker- Charlottesville, Beth Ripple-SVDA, Tracy Smith-Oliver-SWVADA, Alison Douglas-Central, Jessie Ginsburg-NOVA, Janet Brown-SWVADA, Michelle King-NOVA, Jane Palmer-ShenVADA

Minutes from the May 10th meeting were read by Alison Douglas and approved by the board.

Jessie Ginsburg gave the treasurer's report. Our final tax returns for 2008 were filed on May 14th. The combined balances in our accounts are pretty much the same as last month at \$72,128.00. This includes the purchase of the radios.

Chapter reports were given:

SWAVDA is applying to use their grant money for an education day in August. Their Debbie Bowman clinic was a success. Their licensed show will be August 9th and their April show filled two rings.

Central has several youth teams going to the Youth Team Championship. The juniors earned money fundraising. The

club had a successful "How to Run a Horse Show" clinic at Glamorgan Farm in Doswell in June.

ShenValley had a schooling show on June 13th, and even though there were only 28 rides, it still made money. July 18th will be their schooling at Melyni Worth's farm-Cedar creek. Their Fair Show will be the end of August, and they will have a musical freestyle exhibition in combination with the 4-H.

NOVA's breed show wasn't as large as usual, probably because it was the same weekend as the PVDA Ride For Life show. They will re-evaluate the conflict for next year's show. Their June licensed show was large & successful. All their schooling shows have been full. They have been using clinics for fundraising for the team competition entries and for the Adult Camp they will have July 24-26 in Middleburg at Takaro Farm (Sunny's Corner).

SWVADA had a full clinic with Harriet Peterson and their licensed show was also full. Their June Fix A Test clinic only had six rides vs their April one which had twenty-two. There has been some discussion among the board regarding the minimum number of entries they need to have a show vs cancel it. They are not having an August show, but instead are having an Education Day on August 22nd from 10 till 4 at Greenhill Equestrian Park in Salem. They plan to have demo riders at each level, Intro thru FEI, with a commentator,

instruction on lunging for both the horse and rider, saddlefitting, and grooming for shows demonstrations. It will be free to everyone, but there will not be any concessions.

Charlottesville had a June schooling show at Melyni Worth's farm. They are looking at September dates for a licensed show next year in Culpepper. Nancy Lowey has agreed to manage it.

The 2010 Licensed Show Dates calendar was distributed by Tina. It will be posted on VADA's website. Several corrections were noted. NOVA has several dates that aren't solid and SVDA has no dated confirmed.

Board reps are to remind their chapters that volunteers are needed for both the Youth and Adult Team Competitions. These hours count as state volunteer hours.

Blake Crumbliss is the volunteer co-coordinator for the Youth Team. The Youth Team will have a Pizza Party on Friday night and a demonstration by the ATF explosive detecting dog.

There are few entries for the Adult Team; closing is actually 7-8. The "Edgar" award is open to any "team", not only GMO teams.

GAIG should be large this year as Region Three would have to go all the way to West Palm Beach.

Regarding the Anne Gribbons clinic for next year, Morven has not responded to our request for dates. Michelle will check with them one more time for the last weekend in March, otherwise, it'll probably have to roll to 2011.

Twenty radios were purchased and will be ready for the Adult Team Competition. Some of them will be able to have the Horse Center frequency as well.

This was our first teleconference meeting. The call was initiated at 8:00 pm and ended at 9:00 pm. It was well received among participants.

4. Scores determine the medal you can earn bronze, silver and gold at each level.
5. The awards are:
 - Bronze 60.00% - 64.99%
 - Silver 65.00% - 69.99%
 - Gold 70.00% +

Classes: Dressage Equitation, Dressage Suitability, Introductory through FEI Dressage Tests, Combined Tests, and USEA Tests. There will be two divisions, one for juniors and one for seniors. Each level and test will comprise a class, and large classes may be divided further. There will be a Champion and Reserve Champion for each division and level. Champions and Reserve Champions will be determined based on the average scores from each level. An entrant will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion if only one test is ridden in a given level.

Entrants are welcome to ride FEI tests with the understanding that the judges might not be registered/qualified to judge this level.

Entry Fees: \$20.00 per test. \$10.00 per Dressage Equitation/Dressage Suitability test. \$25 per Combined Test. Include a \$5.00 late fee if the entry is not received by the closing date. Refunds require a vet certificate.

From the South and East: Take Route 3 across the Rappahannock River. Go through White Stone and continue into Kilmarnock. Turn right at the second light in Kilmarnock (Route 200, aka Church Street). Go 7 miles to Wicomico Church. In Wicomico Church, turn right onto Route 609 (Remo Road). Go approximately 2 miles and turn left onto Route 665 (Mila Road). Go approximately 2.2 miles (pay attention to signs so that you stay on Mila Road) and Scripture Farms will be on your left.

From the West: Take Route 3 from Warsaw, through Lively, and into Kilmarnock. Go past McDonald's and into downtown Kilmarnock. At light, turn left onto Route 200 (Church Street). See directions above.

Mail your check, made out to 'NEVADA,' to the appropriate show secretary, along with this entry form and a copy of your horse's negative Coggins test results (taken within 12 months prior to the show date).

The undersigned participant, and his/her parent or legal guardian, if the participant is under the age of 18 years, does hereby execute this release, waiver, and indemnification for himself/herself/themselves and his/her/their heirs, successors, representatives, and assigns and, thereby, agree(s) and represents as follows:

- If involved in equine activities pursuant to Section 3.1-796.132 amended of the Code of Virginia, the undersigned(s) execute(s) this waiver of the undersigned(s) rights to sue and agree(s) to assume all risks resulting from the "intrinsic dangers of equine activities." (*"Intrinsic dangers of equine activities" is defined as those dangers or conditions that are an integral part of equine activities, including, but not limited to, (i) the propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death, to persons on or around them; (ii) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (iii) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (iv) collisions with other animals or objects; and (v) the potential of a participant acting in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within the participant's ability.*)
- To release the Northeast Virginia Dressage Association, its members, agents, volunteers, representatives, and those other organizations affiliated with this activity, and hold them harmless from any and all liability, loss, damage, costs, claims, judgments, settlements and/or causes of action, including but not limited to all bodily injuries and property damage arising out of participation in the activity, which may be brought or entered against them as a result of the undersigned persons' participation in equine activity, it being specifically understood that said activity includes the handling of equine by the undersigned participant.

This waiver shall remain valid unless expressly revoked by the participant or Parent or guardian of a minor. The revocation shall be in writing which shall be delivered to the provider and shall become effective thirty (30) days after delivery to the provider. The undersigned(s) should maintain all medical and health insurance needed to cover all risks of any kind in any place in livestock, equine, and/or other activities.

For Schooling Level awards, a minimum of four scores must be NEVADA Schooling Shows; a maximum of two scores may be sanctioned or listed by VADA or by other VADA Chapters and must be USDF tests. For Licensed Show awards, the six scores submitted must be USDF tests from USEF licensed shows. In the case of both Schooling and Licensed Show awards, scores will be averaged.
