VADA BOARD MEETING MINUTES

VADA Teleconference Board Meeting
January 13, 2010

Board Members Present on the call: Dr. Angela Stanaway-NEVADA, Lea Ann Hansen- Central, Alison Douglas-Central, Catherine Kern-Charlottesville, Tina Longaker-Charlottesville, Jessie Ginsburg-NOVA, Sheli King-NOVA, Alison Head-NOVA, , Judith Harroun-Lord-ShenVADA, Jane Palmer-ShenVADA, Tracey Smith-Oliver-SWAVDA, Janet Brown-SWAVDA, Beth Rippel-SVDA, Robyn Nunnally-SVDA, Sandy Johnson-SVDA, Anne Draine-NEVADA. General member: Diane Boyd-NOVA

Minutes from the last meeting are unavailable due to a computer malfunction. Alison Douglas will try to re-create them from a recording.

Treasurer's Report- Jessie Ginsburg reported \$121,147.36 total cash in our accounts. She thinks we made around thirty thousand less ribbons on the GAIG show. Tina thinks it should be closer to fifty thousand and they will reconcile among themselves.

Membership Report- Beth Rippel reported that we have 223 memberships in to USDF and another 103 that she has received but hasn't forwarded on yet. She had not received anything from Fredericksburg, Central and NEVADA chapters. It was noted that we need to look at our by-laws and make sure that the membership years are consistent between the chapters and USDF, i.e. December thru November. Beth reported that she had received communication from USDF that our membership was late and we were subject to a fine, but they accepted the membership list and we have not been fined as of yet.

GAIG Wrap Up- Any outstanding bills need to be turned into Jessie. She and Tina will reconcile to make sure that all income and expenses are accounted for in determining the profit for the event.

Annual Meeting- Reservations need to be sent to Alison by next week. There will be a board meeting that morning at 10:00.

2010 Activities- We will host the BLM show in October and the Adult Team with Charlottesville in September in Culpeper. Tina would like someone to do a write up on the Adult Team for the USDF Connection as it is being run in conjunction with the Charlottesville Twin Shows, kind of a novel idea,. Alison Douglas volunteered. The awards ceremony for the Adult Team will only be on Sunday. VADA will have to determine a method of helping sponsor the chapter teams within the USDF rules, which would not permit us to pay a portion of the entry fees directly as the Adult Team is part of a licensed competition.

Website- It was decided that VADA events calendar on the website should include only VADA events, and clinics sponsored by chapters. Other events, such as clinics hosted by a farm, would need to submit a paid classified ad and be listed under the advertising link. There was also discussion about having a web developer as a VADA position next year. There might be a possibility of generating revenue by selling ad space or links for vendors. The Board will need to consider how much to charge and how these ads or links will be promoted on the website.

Japanese Restaurant Sponsor- Jessie was approached by someone who knows the manager of two Japanese restaurants (one in Woodbridge and one in Charlottesville) and offered to donate funds to the club after members purchased \$1000 in food a month. It was decided that was probably not feasible. Jessie will follow up and suggest that the restaurant donate gift certificates to the silent auction as a way of supporting VADA and generating business.

2010 Chapter Officers & Volunteer of the Year- Tina only has the Chapter Volunteers for the year for Central and NOVA, she needs the rest. Chapters also need to submit their new officers and info for the website and the Purple Book. There were no nominations for the Shel Gafford Award this year.

2011 Clinic- There was some discussion about having a clinic in February, March or April and using the East Complex at the Lexington facility vs. Morven Park. Nothing was definitively planned.

2011 Championships: The Board agreed that VADA should apply to host either the 2011 GAIGs or BLMs, with a preference for the GAIGs. USDF Region 1 will meet in the spring to decide, as there are multiple bids from different GMOs for the GAIGs.

Dianne Boyd reported to the Board that the Horse Center has three capital projects that they are looking to have funded this year: replace lighting, repair the footing in the stalls, and repair the roads. The discussion among the board leaned towards buying new rings and donating them with the understanding that we would not have to pay rental fees for using them for five years. Dianne suggested that VADA consider making a substantial donation to the Horse Center to support these capital improvements. While VADA pays a great deal to rent the facility for the fall show, that amount does not cover these ongoing needs for upgrade and maintenance. She also reported that the NCDCTA headsets we have been borrowing for the judges' commentary at the fall show are getting old, and recommended that VADA purchase new headsets, between 20 and 25 of them. Beth Rippel volunteered to source and price them and report back

to the board. The Board agreed to consider how much to donate to the Horse Center after determining whether VADA's bids to hold one of the regional championships in 2011 is approved by Region 1.

Alison Douglas reported that Central Chapter is urging their members to donate used horse and human riding equipment while doing spring cleaning this year to a worthy non-profit. The club will collect and disseminate. She noted that this might be something that other clubs do for non-profits in their local areas.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:30 pm.

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY RELEASE, WAIVER OF RIGHT TO SUE AND ASSUMPTION OF ALL RISKS

This Equine Activity Release, Waiver of Right to Sue and Assumption of All Risks Agreement (“this Agreement”) is hereby given by the undersigned to Lea Ann Hansen, Michael B. Stanford, Glamorgan Manor, Inc, to each owner of any equine used by any participant in any equine activity, each “equine professional” as defined in the Act (as hereinafter defined), with all the foregoing persons hereinafter referred to collectively as “Owner” and each partner, officer, agent, employee, director, shareholder, member, heir, personal representative, successor and assign of the Owner, and provides as follows:

In consideration for the opportunities provided by the Owner to the undersigned “Participant” (including any minor participant for whom he signs this Agreement) for the enjoyment of the equine activities as a participant, the undersigned hereby agrees as follows:

1. This agreement is given under the Virginia Equine Activity Liability Act (Code of Virginia 3.1-796.130 et seq.) as it may now provide or be hereafter amended (the “Act”). All terms defined by the Act shall have the same meaning herein and the Act is hereby incorporated in this Agreement by reference. This Agreement shall be so construed as to provide to the Owner the fullest protection of a release, waiver of right to sue and assumption of all risks which is afforded to the Owner by the Act.
2. All pronouns shall be construed to include the masculine, feminine or neuter as well as the plural or singular, as may be appropriate to facilitate the construction of this Agreement in the light of the facts presented.
3. The participant hereby acknowledges that he has full and complete notice and understanding of the Act and of all the risks inherent in equine activities which may cause, contribute to or result in the death or personal injury of the participant or damage to the participant’s property (the “risks”) including, but not limited to: (i) the propensity of an equine to behave in dangerous ways or to trip and/or fall; (ii) the inability of anyone whatsoever to predict or foresee an equine’s reaction to excitement, weather conditions, sound, movements, objects, persons, animals, reptiles, birds, or insects, and the effects of such reactions; (iii) the hazards of surface or subsurface conditions, including but not limited to objects or conditions on, under or protruding from the surface, both latent and patent; (iv) the hazards which rocks, cliffs, hills, fences, trees, stumps, logs, bridges, ditches and other debris and obstacles, and any equine activity in connection therewith, may foreseeably or unforeseeably present; (v) the dangers and risks of tack and harness slipping or breaking for whatever reason; (vi) the dangers and risks of becoming entangled in tack, harness, or vehicles used in an equine activity; (vii) the risks of falling from or otherwise becoming unstable on an equine or a vehicle used in an equine activity for any reason whatsoever or for no identifiable reason; and (viii) any negligent act or omission by the sponsor/professional or any Owner which causes or results in death or personal injury of the participant or damage to the participant’s property.
4. The Participant hereby RELEASES and WAIVES all rights which he may have or hereafter have against the Owner for death, personal injury or property damage which is in any way associated with the Risks; he does hereby WAIVE his RIGHT TO SUE or bring any action against the Owner in connection therewith; he agrees to INDEMNIFY and DEFEND the Owner from and to HOLD the Owner HARMLESS against any such suit or action; and he hereby expressly ASSUMES ALL RISKS AND DANGERS of death, personal injury and property damage which are in any way associated with the Risks enumerated in paragraph 3, above.
5. The participant hereby authorizes and consents to any emergency medical care which may at the time appear reasonably appropriate under the circumstances as a result of injury or sickness caused by or incurred in the course of an equine activity.
6. This Agreement shall remain valid in full force and effect from and after the date opposite the signature of the Participant until expressly revoked by the Participant in a written notice personally delivered to the Owner.
7. To the extent possible, this Agreement shall be construed in such a manner as will render it, and each provision of it, fully enforceable; but if any provision of this Agreement shall be unenforceable, such provision (or so much hereof as is unenforceable) shall be deleted and the remainder of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.
8. If this Agreement is executed by the undersigned Participant for and on behalf of a minor Participant named below, the undersigned Participant hereby warrants and represents that he is in fact the legal parent or guardian of such minor, with full

rights of custody and control; that this Agreement is given on behalf of and is binding upon said minor Participant, his heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns; and the undersigned Participant further agrees that this Agreement shall also be as fully binding on the undersigned Participant as if it were entered into solely on his own behalf.

9. This Agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of the Participant.

10. I have fully read and fully understand the foregoing equine liability release waiver of right to sue and assumption of all risks. I have consulted and relied upon my own advisors on all questions in connection therewith, and I have not relied upon the Owner for any advice or explanation in connection therewith.

11. Each of the parties hereto agrees that any suit, action or proceeding arising out of, or relating to, this Agreement be instituted only in the courts of the Commonwealth of Virginia sitting in Caroline County or the United States District Courts for the Eastern District of Virginia; and each of the parties hereby waives any objection which he may have to the laying of the venue of any such suit, action or proceeding and proceeding. Furthermore, the parties hereto hereby knowingly, voluntarily and intentionally waive any rights that they may have to a trial by jury concerning any litigation based here on or in connection with the agreements, relationships or transactions contemplated hereunder.

VADA Central Inc.
RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER, AND INDEMNIFICATION

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily with my horse(s) as a rider, driver, handler, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor in any equine activities in this show. In consideration of my/my child's participation in any equine activities sponsored by VADA Central Inc, I hereby release and waive my rights and the rights of any of my insurers by subrogation to sue VADA Central Inc and any officers, agents and/or representatives for any loss, damage, injury, or death to person or property sustained by me/my child in equine activities by any cause whatsoever, including the intrinsic dangers of equine activity, such as, but not limited to: (1) the propensity of an equine to behave in dangerous ways that may result in injury or death to a participant or bystander or damage to property; (2) the inability to predict an equine's reaction to sound, movements, objects, persons or animals; (3) hazards of surface or subsurface conditions, whether known or unknown; (4) the experience level of any participant in equine activities; (5) a known or unknown health condition of any participant in such equine activities; and (6) the condition and age of the equipment or tack. I assume all the foregoing risks and any other dangers intrinsic to equine activities and accept complete responsibility for making any and all examinations or inspections relating to those risks and any other potential risks of recreational activities, and I agree and understand that VADA Central Inc shall have no responsibility whatsoever to make any such examinations or inspections. I further assume all risk of, and agree to hold harmless VADA Central Inc and its officers, representatives, or agents, or on the part of any other person with regard to such equine activities. If I am a parent or guardian of a participant in equine activities sponsored by VADA Central Inc, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf.

I acknowledge that I have read the following language from the Code of Virginia relating to limited liability on equine activities which reads:

3.2-6202 Liability Limited, Liability Actions Prohibited

A. Except as provided in '3.2-6206, an equine activity sponsor, an equine professional or any other person, which shall include a corporation, partnership, or limited liability company, shall not be liable for an injury to or death of a participant resulting from the intrinsic dangers of equine activities and, except as provided in '3.2-6203, no participant nor any participant's parent, guardian, or representative shall have or make any claim against recover from any equine activity sponsor, equine professional, or any other person for injury, loss, damage or death of the participant resulting from any of the intrinsic dangers of equine activities.

B. Except as provided in '3.2-6202, no participant or parent or guardian of a participant who has knowingly executed a waiver of his rights to sue or agrees to assume all risks specifically enumerated under this subsection may maintain an action against or recover from an equine activity sponsor or an equine professional for an injury to or the death of a participant engaged in an equine activity. The waiver shall give notice to the participant of the intrinsic dangers of equine activities. The waiver shall remain valid unless expressly revoked in writing by the participant or the parent or guardian or a minor.

I hereby certify that the foregoing statements and representations are being made by me knowingly, freely, and voluntarily, and I understand that VADACC is expressly relying upon the foregoing statements and representations in permitting me/my child's participation in any equine activities.

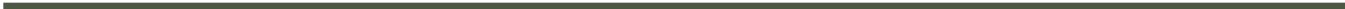
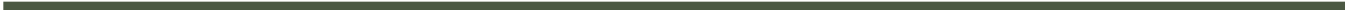
