VADA BOARD MEETING MINUTES

VADA Board Meeting
August 23, 2009
Charlottesville, VA

Members present: Bettina Longaker-Charlottesville, Judith Harroun-Lord-ShenVADA, Jane Palmer-ShenVADA, Dianne Boyd- NOVA, Melyni Worth-Charlottesville, Catherine Kern-Charlottesville, Janet Brown-SWVADA, Tracey Smith-Oliver-SWAVADA, Michelle King-NOVA, Jessie Ginsburg-NOVA, Sharon Ackley- VADAF, Alison Douglas-Central. No representatives were present from NEVADA or SVDA.

Minutes from the previous meeting were read and amended as follows- The Youth Team is not a Championship, it's a Competition. Jill Ramsburg from NOVA was also present on the teleconference.

The next meeting will be on November 16th at 8 pm, as a teleconference. The Board decided two live meetings and two teleconference meetings per year are a good mix. More meetings will be added if necessary.

The Board agreed to purchase 10 more radios at \$174 each.

Treasurer's report-

The balance in the accounts is \$74,142.83. This includes the 5k in the Shel Gafford account. The Partners with Moxie's check was for \$2.13. Jessie will provide information for the VADA website that gives information on how members can get discounts on merchandise and the club gets a rebate. Their website is moxieequestrian.com. Jessie would also like to remind members requesting reimbursement from the club to use the correct form.

Adult Team Competition-

Nancy Lowey provided the Board with a detailed report. Overall she felt the show went well. There was trouble with the porta potties. The name of company is John's Toilets out of Orange and we won't be using them again. Caution to members also.

There was a bit of controversy over the Edgar Hotz Award. This award originally started for just GMO's and then was opened up to any team. Although the introductory team had the highest score, the show officials decided to award it to the next highest scoring team. The rules are not specific, and when the award was first given, intro was not part of the Adult Team. To appease the intro team, 4 little Edgar's were ordered to give to them. This will be brought up at the Region 1 meeting in the fall. The Board will recommend that the award should go to the highest scoring team excluding intro. Also, we will bring up that mix teams should not go into a mix championship, they should go to their level. If we are hosting the Adult Team next year, we will not have a competitor's party. Dianne will check with ESCDTCA to make sure they aren't going to ask to hold it. It was suggested by Melyni that we instead have a musical freestyle challenge with a nice prize open to everyone- costumes also. We could have 2 classes- one is scored and we charge an entry fee- one class is just a demo ride. We could advertise in local newspapers

and draw spectators, bill it as a "bring the kids and a picnic". If we will be hosting it, we'll set up a sub-committee to take the changes to Region 1. Our tentative dates are August 7-8.

Youth Team is July 24-25, 2010, and will be held at Morven Park. NOVA-VADA will be hosting it. Alison Head will be running it.

Recognized Show Calendar for Clubs-

NOVA has a date change to Sept 11-12 2010 for their show and is canceling Nov 2010.

SVDA will have a May 2nd and Aug is questionable.

GAIG Championship-

We have already received entries. Chapters need to push getting classes sponsored. Chapters are asked to sponsor the breakfast cart again. For those of you dying to know, the sweatshirts will be Carolina Blue.

Anne Gribbons Clinic-

We are now asking for 2011 dates even if we have to change facilities. Other ideas for clinicians tossed around by the Board were: George Williams, Debbie McDonald, Betsy Steiner, Hilda Gurney, and Linda Zang.

Chapter updates-

Fredericksburg- Sept show should be full or almost full. They are spending their grant money on fix a test with Carter Bass in November.

NOVA- They are having a musical freestyle clinic Nov 6-8 at Morven Park- auditors welcome- still accepting applications for riders.

SWAVDA- They had a successful "Free fun dressage day". Despite the bad weather they had a great turnout.

Charlottesville- They are working on their show schooling show to be held at end of October.

ShenVADA- They are having a musical freestyle demo on Aug 29th called "Celebrate America". It's a 2 hour program. On Sept 19th, they are having a lunging & cavelleti demo at Foxtail Farm in Edinburg, with a social afterwards- picnic and cookout. They have tentatively scheduled for Oct 31st, a clinic with Kassie Barteau.

Central- They are busy planning for next year's licensed show and are having a schooling show in October.

The room will be upstairs. We will have a wireless microphone for the silent auction so Tina can wander around and generate bids by embarrassment. The board meeting will start at 10. 3. Scores do not need to be earned in one year (2006 and subsequent competitions years are accepted). Scores can only be used once.
4. Scores determine the medal you can earn bronze, silver and gold at each level.
5. The awards are:
 - Bronze 60.00% - 64.99%
 - Silver 65.00% - 69.99%
 - Gold 70.00% +

Classes: Dressage Equitation, Dressage Suitability, Introductory through FEI Dressage Tests, Combined Tests, and USEA Tests. There will be two divisions, one for juniors and one for seniors. Each level and test will comprise a class, and large classes may be divided further. There will be a Champion and Reserve Champion for each division and level. Champions and Reserve Champions will be determined based on the average scores from each level. An entrant will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion if only one test is ridden in a given level.

Entrants are welcome to ride FEI tests with the understanding that the judges might not be registered/qualified to judge this level.

Entry Fees: \$20.00 per test. \$10.00 per Dressage Equitation/Dressage Suitability test. \$25 per Combined Test. Include a \$5.00 late fee if the entry is not received by the closing date. Refunds require a vet certificate.

From the South and East: Take Route 3 across the Rappahannock River. Go through White Stone and continue into Kilmarnock. Turn right at the second light in Kilmarnock (Route 200, aka Church Street). Go 7 miles to Wicomico Church. In Wicomico Church, turn right onto Route 609 (Remo Road). Go approximately 2 miles and turn left onto Route 665 (Mila Road). Go approximately 2.2 miles (pay attention to signs so that you stay on Mila Road) and Scripture Farms will be on your left.

From the West: Take Route 3 from Warsaw, through Lively, and into Kilmarnock. Go past McDonald's and into downtown Kilmarnock. At light, turn left onto Route 200 (Church Street). See directions above.

The undersigned participant, and his/her parent or legal guardian, if the participant is under the age of 18 years, does hereby execute this release, waiver, and indemnification for himself/herself/themselves and his/her/their heirs, successors, representatives, and assigns and, thereby, agree(s) and represents as follows:

- If involved in equine activities pursuant to Section 3.1-796.132 amended of the Code of Virginia, the undersigned(s) execute(s) this waiver of the undersigned(s) rights to sue and agree(s) to assume all risks resulting from the "intrinsic dangers of equine activities." (*"Intrinsic dangers of equine activities" is defined as those dangers or conditions that are an integral part of equine activities, including, but not limited to, (i) the propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death, to persons on or around them; (ii) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (iii) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (iv) collisions with other animals or objects; and (v) the potential of a participant acting in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within the participant's ability.*)
- To release the Northeast Virginia Dressage Association, its members, agents, volunteers, representatives, and those other organizations affiliated with this activity, and hold them harmless from any and all liability, loss, damage, costs, claims, judgments, settlements and/or causes of action, including but not limited to all bodily injuries and property damage arising out of participation in the activity, which may be brought or entered against them as a result of the undersigned persons' participation in equine activity, it being specifically understood that said activity includes the handling of equine by the undersigned participant.

This waiver shall remain valid unless expressly revoked by the participant or Parent or guardian of a minor. The revocation shall be in writing which shall be delivered to the provider and shall become effective thirty (30) days after delivery to the provider. The undersigned(s) should maintain all medical and health insurance needed to cover all risks of any kind in any place in livestock, equine, and/or other activities.

NEVADA YEAR-END AWARDS

Riders must be NEVADA members at the time of the competition for all scores submitted. Submit six tests from your level. (At least one must be the highest test of your level.) For Schooling Level awards, a minimum of four scores must be NEVADA Schooling Shows; a maximum of two scores may be sanctioned or listed by VADA or by other VADA Chapters and must be USDF tests. For Licensed Show awards, the six scores submitted must be USDF tests from USEF licensed shows. In the case of both Schooling and Licensed Show awards, scores will be averaged. Four NEVADA volunteer hours required before scores can be considered. Entries must be post-marked not later than December 1 of the competition year. Submit to:
